Heathlands Grow Your Own

Management of the grow your own plots next to the Wyevale garden centre at Heathlands has now been taken over by Heathlands Grow Your Own Ltd, a new, non-profit-making company that's been formed by and for the plotholders to run the site on their behalf.

The site is located in Heathlands Road, off Nine Mile Ride, Wokingham, RG40 3AS. There are about 100 plots, each roughly 100 m². At present roughly a third of these are still vacant, but they're going fast. A plot costs £12.50 a month, which works out to only £2.88 a week. The first three months are rent free, to give new plotholders a chance to get their plot into shape.

There's plenty of water on site, and structures such as sheds, greenhouses and fruit cages are all allowed. The garden centre facilities are there if needed, including toilets and an excellent café, and a combination lock on the entrance means that plotholders can always access the site even when the centre is closed.

The gardens:

'Devonia' is a plantsman's garden designed for all seasons with areas showcasing different conditions.

24 Lysander Drive is a young, modern square garden, densely planted with architectural shrubs, grasses and small trees.

10 Shaftesbury Close is a woodland garden, planted to reflect the challenges that pine trees offer.

Glenwood Allotments have enthusiastic owners who plant a wide variety of vegetables for all year cropping.

Since its foundation, the National Gardens Scheme has donated over £45 million to nominated beneficiaries, of which nearly £23 million has been donated within the last ten years. The main beneficiaries are Macmillan Cancer Support, Marie Curie, and Hospice UK


