Grow Bags are still available, together with a full range of composts. A reminder that although we no longer stock Clover, we do have a peat-based alternative which is Evergreen Compost, \pounds 6.55 for a 60L bag.

Now the weather is finally warming up you may be thinking of planting up hanging baskets and containers. We have a range of baskets available or if you want to re-use an existing one, we have basket liners in both 12 & 14". Multicote slow-release fertiliser granules and swell gel will make for an easier job in feeding and watering your baskets and containers.

TRIPS

COACH TRIP EARLSTONE MANOR

Please note the change of date from that previously given as I could not book a coach! New date: Wednesday 24th July

We will be going to visit Earlstone Manor, acquired by Highclere Castle at the end of the 18th Century. It was a tenanted farm for many years and the original gardens all but disappeared until replanting and landscaping began in the late 1980s. After much research and planning by the current owner (a passionate

grower of English Box) the grounds have been recreated over the past 30 years to reflect an Elizabethan Jacobean Garden. A lovely garden.

The coach size for this trip is a 35-seater from Hodges Coaches.



We will depart from Owlsmoor Community Centre from the bus stop at 10.30am. Please be there by 10.15am. We will travel to the pub The Carpenters Arms in Burghclere for lunch arriving at approx. 11.30am (Lunch needs to be pre-ordered and a deposit paid) Details to follow as I do not have the menu at



present. We leave the pub 1.30pm to travel to Earlstone Manor for 2pm. On arrival we go into the large barn for an information talk and have tea and cakes. We depart Earlstone Manor at 5pm arriving back at Owlsmoor Community Centre approx. 6pm.



The grounds may be uneven and slippery in places as I noticed when I visited after rain. The narrow paths are not suitable for wheelchairs or for visitors with mobility issues, but you could still listen to the talk and visit the top area of the grounds. COST OF THIS TRIP IS £33 coach, drivers tip, talk tea and cake at Earlstone Manor LUNCH is EXTRA - to be sorted later.

Please note: at the gardens there is to be no taking pictures of the house or buildings.
