TRADING HUT

Sunday 10th November is Remembrance Sunday, so the Trading hut is open this **Saturday 9th November instead of Sunday**, usual time of 9.00 to 10.45 am. After this weekend the hut is open for two more weeks until we close for the winter. Our last day of opening is Sunday 24th November.

- There is still time to plant Autumn onions for an earlier harvest around June. These are available in the hut with both Autumn Champion (was Shakespeare) and Blood Red available in 250g bags. Now half price at £1.75 per bag.
- Shallots (400g at £4.25) and garlic (£2 per bulb) are still available.
- News supplies of honey are in hand, so there should be some available soon.

There's still time to stock up for the winter and get ready for those early tasks in the new year. There's a good supply of Woodland Mulch, same product, same price but in Ornamental Bark Bags because the supplier had run out of the 'normal' bags.

Supplies of multi-purpose compost are good in both peat and peat free, plus John Innes Seed Compost for those early sowings in January before the hut re-opens. We currently have Composted Stable Manure for autumn and winter mulching We're planning to do the stock take at the trading hut on Monday 25th November from 10.00 am.
